## Children's Book

#### PROCESS:

Each Participant will:

- Be certain that the participant is registered for this event no later than the registration deadline.
- Write a children's story that reflects the current year's LTC theme or Bible Bowl study book(s).
- Mail the entry to the Event Coordinator on or before the preconvention event deadline.

The Event Coordinator will:

- Assume responsibility for the Mid-West LTC Children's Book Event.
- Find adult volunteers to evaluate the projects. Be certain that each project is evaluated by **at least** two volunteers.
- Report results and provide critique sheets to the Awards Committee.

#### **GUIDELINES**

Participant Eligibility

- This event is available to students in grades 3 through 12. Children's Books will be evaluated with the grade level of the participant in consideration.
- Individuals & Teams: Participants may work on a project individually or as a team. One person may write the story and another may illustrate.

### Writing Assignment

- The story must be submitted in book form (bound with staples, thread, glue, comb binding, etc.). Consider looking online for ideas on how to make homemade books.
- The story must be illustrated (drawing, cartoon, photographs, digital art) with original (no use of copyrighted) art work.
- The story may be written in any form of fiction/non-fiction (e.g. mystery, action, humor, fable, etc.) as long as it reflects the current year's LTC theme or Bible Bowl study book. The connection to the LTC theme or Bible Bowl study book may be reflected anywhere in the story, climax or conclusion, as long as it is clearly and accurately taught or presented.
- Handwritten work is admissible if legible and neatly presented. Software and/or online tools may be used.

#### Writing Tips:

Use of detail: In creative and personal writing, describe with specific

detail, trying to create an experience in your reader's mind, with colors, sounds, textures, etc. Stories should use dialogue and develop believable characters.

- Language: Creative and vivid; correct use of words; grammatical correctness; use of figurative language (metaphors, similes, etc.).
- Structure: Every piece of writing should have a flow from beginning to middle to end that carries your reader through and holds his/her interest. Stories should have a carefully developed plot.
